### **Context:**

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) Thailand Country Office (CO) is committed to evidence-based response and continually seeks to enhance the availability of information about voluntary and forced migration. The demand for migration and displacement research and studies is increasing and contributes to show the complexity and diversity of mobility in Thailand and the sub-region. The IOM Thailand Migration Data and Research Unit (MDRU) aims to harmonize data and research initiatives within the CO, as well as strengthen linkages to external partners (National Statistics Office (NSO), academic institutions, UN and NGO partners, etc.).

The MDRU will contribute to the objectives of the IOM Migration Data Strategy: 1. Strengthen evidence base on migration; 2. Develop capacity of States to enhance migration evidence base; 3. Ensure evidence-based IOM and UN system-wide programming. Under the framework of the Asia Regional Migration Program (Asia RMP) and other programs, IOM has been implementing data collection activities in Thailand and neighbouring countries, to develop a better

understanding of regional human mobility patterns and of the vulnerabilities of migrant populations in Southeast Asia. IOM has also worked actively to share key findings with government and non-government counterparts, through regular dissemination of reports and data products at workshops, briefings and webinars. Through its various units, the CO has further been engaging in a wide range of data collection and research in different thematic areas, including labour migration, displacement, migrant protection, counter trafficking and migrant health. Migration data is also collected by a range of partners. Moving forward, the CO aims to better integrate the various data initiatives within IOM Thailand, and to increase synergies with other data actors, to provide a more holistic understanding of the migration dynamics in Thailand and the wider region under the umbrella of the DRU.

Under the direct supervision of IOM Thailand's Chief of Mission (CoM), and in close collaboration with the respective Heads of Units in the CO, as well as the Head of the Regional Data Hub (RDH) for Asia and the Pacific, the Head of Unit (Migration Data and Research Unit) will oversee all research-related activities within the CO for Thailand, and manage the implementation of Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) projects and interventions within the CO for Thailand and under the Asia RMP. The successful candidate will also be responsible for the implementation of activities that aim to build government capacity in the management and use of migration data, and for the coordination of joint research activities between IOM and partners.

### ***Core Functions / Responsibilities:***

1. Provide strategic, technical, and operational inputs, as well as coordination and support for the design, development and implementation of IOM Thailand's data and research initiatives.
2. Identify synergies between the research initiatives of different thematic units and encourage and contribute to cross-cutting analysis for a holistic understanding of the situation, vulnerabilities and needs of migrants.
3. Support capacity building on good research practice and responsible data collection and use. Provide guidance to the different thematic units in the planning of research interventions, development of survey and assessment tools, and analysis of data.
4. In coordination with the RDH, review and endorse research outputs prior to their publication.
5. Strengthen IOM's engagement with the NSO, other government counterparts and UN partners, aiming to increase capacity to manage, analyze and use migration data.
6. In coordination with Programme Support Unit staff, contribute to the development of resource mobilization efforts for IOM research activities by developing concept notes and project proposals in response to data needs identified by regional, national and local counterparts.
7. In coordination with Communications colleagues, ensure production and strategic dissemination of communication materials to document relevant activities, achievements and impacts in the form of Press Briefing Notes, social media updates, website content and other material as relevant.
8. Act as Coordinator for the implementation, coordination, and monitoring of all interventions and projects under DTM, ensuring compliance of financial, administrative, and technical aspects, in accordance with IOM policies and standards, as well as donor requirements, and in coordination with relevant IOM units, including the RO.
9. Oversee the improvement of existing and establishment of ongoing DTM mechanisms, tools and methods, including mobility tracking, flow monitoring, needs assessment, and other information gathering and monitoring systems.

10. Oversee the recruitment, training, and direct supervision of DTM staff.
11. Ensure the provision of timely, accurate, standardized, and adequate information (including DTM reports, factsheets, etc.) to all relevant stakeholders regarding mobility trends, conditions in migrant-hosting areas, as well as the situation of vulnerable groups.
12. Ensure that DTM activities are aligned with the needs of other IOM units and partners, including through regular consultations and feedback cycles.
13. Liaise with IOM colleagues (DTM and other thematic units, as applicable) at a regional/global level to support dissemination of information, contribute to internal and external communication materials, ensure complementarity and compatibility of activities, feed into relevant regional or global reporting, and support global DTM and research development initiatives, including through identification of best practices, new approaches and technologies.
14. Ensure the integration of gender perspectives and attention to specific needs of vulnerable populations, such as pregnant women, persons with disabilities, older persons, children, as well as other highly vulnerable groups within data collection and research activities, including through mainstreaming of Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse into data collection operations.
15. Ensure strict adherence to IOM's data protection principles across all programming interventions and build capacity of DTM staff, enumerators and research partners in the field of data protection.
16. Undertake duty travel as requested to monitor, support and resolve issues related to data collection and research activities across Thailand and other relevant Program countries.
17. Represent IOM and participate in national fora on migration and mobility when requested to support improved coordination on data and evidence for policy and guidance at the regional level.
18. When requested, work with the RDH to develop tailored data and evidence analysis on specific issues to support IOM and its partners' policy analysis objectives.
19. Perform such other duties that may be assigned.

### ***Required Qualifications and Experience:***

#### **Education**

- Master's degree from an accredited academic institution, preferably in Data Science, Political or Social Sciences, Development Studies, International Relations or Law with a minimum of five years of relevant professional experience; or
- University degree in the above fields with seven years of relevant professional experience.

#### **Experience**

- Demonstrated experience in project implementation, data collection and analysis, and/or information management activities, preferably with an international or intergovernmental organization working on issues related to migrants and vulnerable populations;
- Experience and understanding of the migration context in Southeast Asia;
- Demonstrated experience and understanding of displacement tracking tools and methodologies.
- Experience in supervising and managing large teams;
- Experience in organizing and delivering workshops, trainings, webinars and briefings; and,

- Experience in working with national and/or local government counterparts in the field of migration data will be considered an advantage.

## Skills

- Knowledge of and experience with monitoring and evaluation processes;
- Familiarity with IOM's DTM is required;
- Excellent writing, communication and negotiation skills;
- Computer literate;
- Familiarity with Kobo, InDesign, Adobe Illustrator, R (or similar analysis software) will all be considered an advantage;
- Excellent analytical abilities and demonstrated capacity to draft and edit reports;
- Knowledge of budgeting and planning;
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to maintain trust and good working relationships with counterparts;
- Capacity for creative thinking;
- Team-oriented, but with capacity to work independently and with minimal supervision;
- Personal commitment, efficiency, and flexibility; and,
- Strong organizational and time management skills, and ability to deliver under tight timelines;

## Languages

For this position, fluency in English is required (oral and written). Working knowledge of Thai, Khmer, Myanmar, Lao and/or Vietnamese is an advantage.
