Context:

Background Information

The internship is in the Programme Unit, which coordinates the areas of project development and implementation under the supervision of the Project Coordinator.

Supervision

Under the overall supervision of the Head of Office and direct supervision of the Project Coordinator, the Intern – Programme Unit will support the unit in the development of the mission portfolio as well as implementation of project activities.

Core Functions / Responsibilities:

1. Provide assistance in the implementation of project activities.
2. Retrieve, compile, summarize, and present information/data on specific project topics.
3. Support implementation of project activities, involving liaison with diverse organizational units or external parties to initiate requests and follow up on actions.
4. Draft status reports, correspondence, briefing notes, graphics, statistical tables, presentations, and other forms of documentation.
5. Support the organization of meetings, workshops, and training sessions.
6. Respond to general information requests and inquiries; set up and maintain files/records.
7. Perform other related duties as assigned.

Training Components and Learning Elements

It is expected that the selected intern will:

- Be involved in the activities of IOM in the duty station.
- Gain an understanding of the IOM and the UN System and its processes.
- Learn technical skills described in this Post Description.

- Be able to prove their dedication, skills, and capacity to work in an international setting as part of a diverse and international team.

Required Qualifications and Experience:

Education

The applicant, at the time of application, must:

- Be enrolled in the final academic year of a first university degree programme (minimum Bachelor's level or equivalent) in the following fields: Political or Social Science, Law, International Affairs or a related field from an accredited academic institution; or
- Be enrolled in a graduate school programme (second university degree or equivalent, or higher) in the following fields: Political or Social Science, Law, International Affairs or a related field from an accredited academic institution; or
- Have graduated with a university degree and, if selected, must commence the internship within one year of graduation in the following fields: Political or Social Science, Law, International Affairs or a related field from an accredited academic institution.

Experience

- Experience in liaising with governmental authorities, national/international institutions, United Nations agencies and non-governmental organizations would be an asset.
- Experience working with different vulnerable categories of persons as well as vulnerable communities will be considered an advantage.
- Prior work experience with international humanitarian organizations, non-government or government institutions/organizations in a multi-cultural setting is an advantage.
- Experience working with educational institutions would be an asset.

Skills

- Strong organizational skills.
- Ability to timely understand the Organization's structure and portfolios.
- Ability to work effectively and harmoniously in a team of colleagues of varied cultural and professional backgrounds.
- Proven ability to produce quality work accurately and concisely according to set deadlines.
- Ability to multi-task, prioritize and work independently.

Languages

IOM's official languages are English, French, and Spanish. All staff members are required to be fluent in one of the three languages.

For this position, fluency in English and Macedonian is required (oral and written). Working knowledge of another official UN language (Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian, and Spanish) is an advantage.

Proficiency of language(s) required will be specifically evaluated during the selection process, which may include written and/or oral assessments.

Note

Eligibility and Selection

This internship opportunity is part of IOM's Diversity and Inclusion Internship Program 2024. **The selected candidate for this internship position will work in the IOM Office in North Macedonia.**

This post is subject to local recruitment. Only those holding a valid residence and work permit for the country where this position is based will be eligible for consideration.

An additional main condition is that the applicant identifies as a person with a disability.

Interns will receive a monthly stipend.

In general, the Internship Programme aims at attracting talented students and graduates who:

- a) have a specific interest in, or whose studies have covered, areas relevant to IOM programmes and activities;
- b) are holding a scholarship for internship placements in international organizations and/or for whom internship is required to complete their studies; or
- c) are sponsored by governmental/non governmental institutions and/or academia to work in specific areas relevant to both IOM and the sponsor.
- d) are either enrolled in the final academic year of a first university degree programme (minimum Bachelor's level or equivalent) or have graduated in the last 12 months.
- e) are at least 20 years old.

- Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted, and additional enquiries will only be addressed if the candidate is shortlisted.
- Depending on experience and location, IOM provides a small monthly stipend to help offset costs.
- The internship programme will be supporting the IOM Mission in Skopje, North Macedonia.
